The Nurse Practitioner is a licensed independent practitioner who is responsible for managing health problems and coordinating health care for family planning patients in accordance with State and Federal rules and regulations and the nursing standards of care (assessment of health status, diagnosis, development of plan of care and treatment, implementation of treatment plan, and evaluation of patient status).

Primary Responsibilities:

- Develops patient care plans by obtaining medical histories; examining patients; documenting patient physical condition, psychological status, and influencing social factors; developing a diagnosis; establishing patient care objectives; defining interventions, schedules, and timetables.
- Provides patient care by providing treatments, writing prescriptions, and coordinating with other healthcare providers. Provides physical, emotional, and psychological support to patients.
- Educates patients on family planning contraceptive methods and healthy lifestyle choices. Establishes patient goals in partnership with the patient. Educates patients on diagnosed conditions, medications, and self-care skills; answers questions and provides information and resources.
- Evaluates patient care by reviewing patient records, noting changing conditions and needs, measuring health outcomes against patient care standards, re-evaluating care objectives, modifying care plan, making or recommending necessary adjustments, and clearly documenting services in electronic health record.
- Assures quality care by adhering to professional standards, organization policies and procedures and federal, state, and local regulations, including CDPHE Family Planning program requirements.
- Maintains safe, secure, and healthy patient care environment by adhering to infection-control policies and protocols, medication administration and storage procedures, and controlled substance regulations. Adheres to legal regulations and organization standards and policies. Alerts others regarding potential concerns.

Additional Responsibilities:

- Protects healthcare organization value by keeping information confidential and cautioning others regarding potential breaches.
- Improves Nurse Practitioner job knowledge by attending educational workshops, reviewing professional publications, establishing personal networks, benchmarking state-of-the-art practices and participating in professional societies.
- Maintains cooperative relationships among team members. Contributes to organization success by welcoming related, different and new requests and contributing to the accomplishments of others.

- 1 year or more in Nurse Practitioner role preferred, specifically in family planning/reproductive health.
- Recent NP graduates encouraged to apply.
- AANP - American Association of Nurse Practitioners in the State of Colorado.
- APRN-BC - Advanced Practice Registered Nurse, Board Certified in the State of Colorado.
- NextGen (EHR) experience.
- Strong communication skills with the ability to verbally convey information effectively.
- Excellent active listening skills, giving full attention to what others are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as appropriate, and not interrupting at inappropriate times.
- Awareness of others' reactions and understanding why they react as they do.
- Problem solver and analytical thinker with the ability to apply scientific rules and methods to complex problems.
- Helpful and collaborative workstyle, actively looking for ways to help others.
- Spanish proficiency preferred.
- Ability to provide care to a diverse patient population including adolescents, non-English speakers and members of the LGBTQ community including transgender patients. Willingness to be trained to see male patients if not experienced in that population.
